What a month it has been here in TJ! It feels like just yesterday when I was hopping on a plane to Dallas to meet my team for Engage the Nations training. I guess time flies when you're serving the LORD! It was a month full of victories and challenges, and with each day God has made it more clear that spending my summer this way was exactly what I needed. Sometimes God calls us to move away and step out of our comfort zones so that we can depend more fully on Him. I'm reminded of the story of Abraham —

"For the LORD had said to Abram, 'Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others." (Genesis 12:1-2)

Abraham's incredible adventure with God began with a change of locale, and God promised that blessing follows his obedience. My prayer this summer is that through deeper, more consistent obedience to God in my own life, I will be a blessing to those around me.

So where to begin? I guess I can start with my training in Dallas... and WOW. It was one of the most impactful times of my life. 

After a short flight over to San Diego, Pastor Jonathan with **All Peoples Church Tijuana** picked us up from the airport and we drove a mere 30 minutes to San Ysidro, the busiest border crossing in the world! It is quite a chaotic place, with thousands of pedestrians and vehicles passing back and forth every day. The city of Tijuana expands endlessly before us (population just under 2 million), but comes to a bizarre, abrupt stop at the US border wall. In light of this observation God gave me a word – in spite of this wall's constant, oppressive presence in this city, which represents so much hurt and pain, God wants to **break down walls** in people so they can come to know His incredible, **unconditional love** for them.

Once we settled into our apartments (right on the ocean I might add), and consumed the **best tacos** our neighborhood has to offer, we began our first week as official interns for All Peoples Church Tijuana! The staff here is amazing, and through their pursuit of **intentional relationships** with each other and the people of their church, the congregation has grown tremendously these past few months. The Sunday morning *reuniones* are so much fun, with everyone worshipping Jesus with so much passion and a lot of *spanglish*! A testimony from that first Sunday was something God did in this girl named Tania. She had heard about All Peoples almost two years ago, but never visited on a Sunday morning. Then through an ad on Facebook, she randomly decided to check it out. After church, she began talking with us interns and we all decided to go out to lunch. She was enjoying her time so much that she hung out with us for the rest of the day, coming back to the church to help us with the youth that evening! My teammate Mary was able to pull Tania aside while we were setting up and she shared the gospel with her. **Tania ended up giving her life to Jesus** through that conversation! It was just so crazy to see Tania's hunger and willingness to hang around for the entire day, even though it was her first time coming to church. Praise God for her life!

The next week was pretty tough, for the entire team was sick at some point. Through that time however, God taught us the **power of intercession**. For those of us that weren't feeling well enough for outreach that day, we stayed back at the church and prayed for the rest of the team as they were out in the city. We all had such a change of heart, and we realized that an increase in prayer results in an increase in the awareness of the Holy Spirit. It was such an encouraging and powerful time, and since then my prayer life has never been the same.

Later that week once I had fully recovered, I was able to help deliver tires to the house of a lady named Sara in our church. Her home is precariously perched on a hillside, and due to a recent landslide, a retaining wall needs to be built to keep the house from sliding away. I joked that as an architect, I never thought I would choose old tires to build a retaining wall, but they actually work really well! A testimony from that week was a new relationship formed with a guy named Javier, who just so happens to be an architecture student at a university here in Tijuana! He is so kind and so eager to learn more about God and about All Peoples Church. We went out to lunch to share each other's stories, geek out about architecture things, and talk about Jesus. I look forward to continuing to grow our friendship and ultimately inviting him into a life-long relationship with Jesus.

The following week was very special to me because five people from Antioch Baton Rouge came to Tijuana for their College Ministry Mission Trip! One of the major goals of the week was to host a **Vacation Bible School** for the kids of a neighborhood up in the hills called *Cardenas*. It was blast singing songs, playing games, and teaching the kiddos that "nada es imposible para Dios"! Numerous niños were impacted by Jesus that week, as were their parents. Additionally, as the music was playing and the kids were screaming, people from the neighborhood would stop by to see what was going on. This opened even more opportunities to share the love of Jesus with people and pray for healing! One man **gave his life to Jesus** during that time and another woman was **healed of back pain!** Praise God!

Another incredible testimony occurred when I went with the Baton Rouge team to the **General Hospital of Tijuana** which serves the people of the city who do not have health insurance. Needless to say, the hospital is completely overloaded with patients and many people do not receive care. Due to security reasons, we do not have access to the emergency room to pray for and minister to patients. However, a way around this is to clean the restrooms and the waiting room for patients' family and friends. It is

quite a depressing scene, for some of these people stay here for weeks, or even months, as their loved ones are waiting for treatment. Nevertheless, what a privilege we had to bring the hope of Jesus to these people. After we finished cleaning, someone on our team shared their testimony and the Gospel, and we began to pray for people and encourage them. I was with my friend Lucky who felt the LORD tell him that a man adjacent to us had pain in his right leg. This man was wearing long pants, so there was no way of telling beforehand if there was anything that ailed him. I go over to ask him if his right leg hurt and sure enough it did! Eagerly, Lucky and I prayed for him, and all of the pain went away in Jesus' name! This man was so shocked by this miracle, especially that we specifically knew about his pain in the first place. I shared how the Holy Spirit revealed that to Lucky, and that God desires to speak in similar ways to him. We prayed for the man to receive the Holy Spirit and to receive salvation in Jesus. I left that conversation in awe of Jesus and that He is indeed a God of miracles!


